## Biographical Sketch

Robert Donald Clark, professor of speech, dean, author, public speaker, and university president, was born in Frontier County, Nebraska, in 1910. He received a B. A. in English (with a minor in History) from Pasadena College in 1931 and a M. A. in Speech from the University of Southern California in 1935. During this period he also taught Freshman Composition classes at Pasadena College (1931-35 and 1937-38), and was the pastor of the Riverside Nazarene Church for one year (1936). Clark earned his Ph.D. from USC while teaching speech, first at the College of the Pacific, Stockton Junior College (1939-42), and subsequently at the University of Oregon (1943-64), where he reinstated extracurricular debate in a program called Symposium. Clark earned his Ph.D. in 1946 with a dissertation entitled "The Platform and Pulpit Career and Rhetorical Theory of Bishop Matthew Simpson." Around this same time, Clark began to involve himself in university administration at UO, accepting an appointment as Assistant Dean of the College of Liberal Arts (CLA) in 1947, which he retained until being selected as Dean of CLA in 1955. His administrative duties did not keep him from his writing, and in 1956 he published The Life of Matthew Simpson. In 1961, Clark was named Dean of Faculties at UO, and three years later, he accepted the Presidency of San Jose State College (1964-1969), a period characterized by student unrest, racial tensions, and a faculty strike in late 1968. In 1969, he returned to the University of Oregon as its eleventh president, a position he held until his retirement in 1975. Clark was a popular president at both institutions, and was known for his dedication to the rights of students and curricular innovation. While at San Jose State, Clark established an interdisciplinary undergraduate education program called the New College, and at University of Oregon he worked on committees dedicated to similar ends. At the conclusion of his educational and administrative career, Clark was chosen as the namesake for the Robert D. Clark Honors College at UO in 1975. After retirement, Clark continued to take an active role in the Eugene community, participating in local and international citizens' groups. He also continued to research and write numerous articles and books, including The Odyssey of Thomas Condon: Irish Immigrant, Frontier Missionary, Oregon Geologist, published in 1989.

### Scope and Content Note

The Robert D. Clark Papers consist of correspondence, schoolwork, speeches, writings, research notes, publications, administrative reports and memoranda, and reference files that relate to Clark's work as a speech professor, university administrator, public speaker, and writer. Where his correspondence is directly associated with a specific personal or professional role or organization, it is integrated into the series and/or subseries pertinent to that role. Where Clark organized his letters generically by date, without regard to subject matter or specific correspondent, I have sorted these chronologically in the Correspondence series.

The collection includes Clark's Matthew Simpson manuscripts, Matthew Simpson doctoral dissertation, Thomas Condon manuscripts and research materials, and reports and correspondence relating to the faculty strike, Olympic boycott, and issues of student unrest during Clark's five years as President of San Jose State College. The papers from his tenure as President of the University of Oregon include general administrative correspondence and memoranda, many speeches on various subjects, and materials relating to Honors programs and the Robert D. Clark Honors College. A few items of note include one n.d. note from Ken Kesey, correspondence between Clark and Faye Kesey, many letters between Clark and Tom McCall, Governor of Oregon, and an early (March 30, 1943) letter written and signed by Orson Welles. Further, there is a large volume of clippings and publications on a wide variety of subjects, including student unrest, speech and oratory, higher education and honors programs, and political issues, the last of which Clark probably used as debate topics. These clippings are largely concentrated into the Reference Files series.

The collection contains only scant materials relating to student unrest at the University of Oregon, and contains nothing specifically relating to Clark's year as a pastor (1936). There are a few photographs, mostly in the Personal Series, depicting Clark in group shots with professional organizations, or at the podium during commencements or speaking engagements.

Wherever possible, I have given a date range for the materials that constitute each subseries. These ranges may not reflect the full date range of the materials when there are n.d. items listed in the subseries, which is frequently the case. In the subseries of Clark's work-related papers, the given date ranges indicate the years he held each position. In general, and unless otherwise noted, I have favored a chronological organizing principle; when n.d. materials occur in a subseries, they are placed at the beginning, preceding the dated materials.
